Delta County Forest-Land Policies/Regulations

(Adopted by the Delta Conservation District 2018)

- Access to or on County Property:
 - Main Roads: Open year-around
 - > Secondary Roads: Open seasonal (motorized) -- Depending on weather conditions, maintenance requirements and logging operations. Closed each spring due to break-up conditions.
 - > Trails: NO motorized vehicles allowed (walking only).
 - > NO off-road motorized access allowed.
- Road Maintenance: Any work on main or secondary roads crossing and/or on County land is not permitted unless written permission has been attained.
- Parking Violations: Parking in front of gates (motorized roads and/or trails) is not allowed in case of emergency access needs. Parking within the road—way on main and/or secondary roads that are open is not allowed do to narrowing of traffic access.
- Hunting Blinds are allowed:
 - > must have proper ID visible from the outside (name, address, phone number).
 - > not allowed directly in or on roads and/or trails; also not allowed to be placed where hunter may shoot down a road and/or trail (cross-shooting is allowed).
 - ➤ All blinds must be removed after the hunting season for which blind is being used; No blinds allowed after Jan. 2nd (any blind left on County property after Jan. 2nd without written permission will be considered abandoned and destroyed).
 - > NO nails, screws or bolts are to be used to attach to vegetation (any item that penetrates through the bark is illegal, including screw-in tree steps).
 - > It is illegal to cut, break, etc. branches, limbs, trees or other vegetation for shooting lanes or to construct blinds.
 - > Hunters with Disabilities: Please contact the DCD for permitted special conditions.
- Baiting is allowed:
 - > Sept. 15 thru Jan. 1st;
 - > State of Michigan U.P. legal regulations must be followed (NO exceptions).
- Disposal of Carcasses: the dumping of any carcass is illegal. All carcasses must be removed from County property and should be disposed of in an approved landfill.
- During hunting and/or trapping seasons, all Michigan hunting and trapping laws and regulations on public-land apply and will be enforced (Michigan Hunting Digest).
- NO littering of any kind. Natural Resources & Environmental Protection Act 451.
 All littering laws apply (324.8905a).

- Rustic Camping is allowed on County land with a permit. Permits are free and must be
 posted at your campsite (Contact the DCD for permit information: (906) 553-7700).
 Camping can only be done in areas that have a suitable-size for the camp site (NO cutting,
 injuring or destroying any vegetation). No camping is allowed in the parking area adjacent
 to the partnership/MNRTF sign & associated walking trail-head.
- Privately installed gates, roads, trails and/or buildings/structures are not permitted (except blinds during the appropriate hunting seasons).
- NO cutting, injuring or destroying trees, shrubs, grass, turf, plants, crops or soil. Michigan Penal Code Act 328 (750.382).
- NO destruction of property; logs or timber. Act 328 (750.384).
- NO destruction of property; fences, gates or opening gates. Act 328 (750.381).
- NO destruction of property; boundary markers, buildings, defacing inscriptions or sign boards. Act 328 (750.383).
- No destruction or defacing of property; signs or notices. Act 328 (750.385).
